Spiritual Gifts Definitions

The Bible does not lock us into restrictions as to the number of spiritual gifts, or even their definitions. The four major lists of gifts are found in Romans 12:6-8, *I Corinthians* 12:1-11, 27-31, *Ephesians* 4:11-12, and *I Peter* 4:9-11, but there are other scriptures that mention or illustrate gifts not included in these lists. All gifts are given to help the church fulfill its purpose: "To make disciples, more disciples, better disciples."

The gift of administration is the God-given ability to understand what makes an organization function, and the special ability to plan and execute procedures that accomplish the goals of the ministry. 1 Corinthians 12:28, Acts 6:1-7, Exodus 18:13-26
The gift of counseling is the God-given ability to listen, encourage and guide with sensitivity. II Corinthians 1:3-7, Romans 12:8
The gift of craftsmanship is the God-given ability to creatively design and/or construct items to be used for ministry. Exodus 31:3, 35:31-35, Acts 9:36-39, II Kings 22:5-6
The gift of creative communication is the God-given ability to communicate God's truth through a variety of art forms. <i>Psalm 150:3-4</i> , <i>II Samuel 6:14-15</i> , <i>Mark 4:2</i> , 3
The gift of encouragement is the God-given enablement to present truth so as to strengthen, comfort, or urge to action those who are discouraged or wavering in their faith. <i>Romans</i> 12:8, <i>Acts</i> 11:22-24, <i>Acts</i> 15:30-32
The gift of evangelism is the God-given enablement to effectively communicate the gospel to unbelievers so they respond in faith and move toward discipleship. <i>Ephesians 4</i> :11, Acts 8:26-40, Luke 19:1-10
The gift of giving is the God-given enablement to contribute money and resources to the work of the Lord with cheerfulness and liberality. Romans 12:8, II Corinthians 6:8, Luke 21:1-4
The gift of helps is the God-given enablement to accomplish practical and necessary tasks that free up support, and meet the needs of others. <i>I Corinthians</i> 12:28, <i>Romans</i> 12:7
The gift of hospitality is the God-given enablement to care for people by providing fellowship, food, and shelter. I Peter 4:9-10, Romans 12:13, Hebrews 13:1-2

Leadership	The gift of leadership is the God-given enablement to cast vision, motivate, and direct people to harmoniously accomplish the purposes of God. Romans 12:8, Hebrews 13:17, Luke 22:25-26
Mercy	The gift of mercy is the God-given enablement to cheerfully and practically help those who are suffering or are in need, compassion moved to action. Romans 12:8, Matthew 5:7, Mark 10:46-52, Luke 10:25-37
Prophecy or Preaching	The gift of prophecy is the God-given enablement to reveal truth and proclaim it in a timely and relevant manner for understanding, correction, repentance, or edification. <i>Romans</i> 12:6, <i>I Corinthians</i> 12:10 & 28, 13:2, <i>II Peter</i> 1:19-21
Shepherding	The gift of shepherding is the God-given enablement to nurture, care for, and guide people toward on-going spiritual maturity and becoming like Christ. <i>Ephesians 4</i> :11-12, <i>I Peter 5</i> :1-4, <i>John 10</i> :1-8
Teaching	The gift of teaching is the God-given enablement to understand, clearly explain, and apply the word of God, causing greater Christ-likeness in the lives of listeners. Romans 12:7, I Corinthians 12:28, Acts 18:24-28, II Timothy 2:2
