During this unprecedented time, our community groups can still serve together from the safety of your own homes. Below are some opportunities that will help your group get started.

- Notes of Encouragement Community groups select a specific group of people, (i.e. a local nursing home), to mail notes/cards of hope to brighten someone's day.
- Phone call Rotation Do you know someone who is isolated alone during these tough times? Each group member chooses a day of the week to call this person so they will hear from someone everyday.
- Email of Gratitude Each member of the group chooses 1-2 people that have really made an impact in your life and email them a thankful letter.
- Birthday Videos Organize a collection of short video clips from members of your group wishing "Happy birthday _____" or jump on a zoom call and record your group singing happy birthday to whoever is celebrating in quarantine.
- Friends in Need Elect someone in the group to collect monetary donations from each member (use PayPal, etc.) and then order a "care basket" to send to someone you know who is in need of essential items; toothbrush, toothpaste, shampoo, conditioner, snacks, etc. (Use Amazon for delivery)
- Community Prayer If the neighborhood, where you usually meet, has a Facebook page, ask for prayer requests and then anonymously send them out to the group on a specific day and meet for a Zoom prayer hour.

Neighborhood Joy Project - Choose an image, (rainbows, hearts, teddy bears, etc.) to draw/color and place picture in a front window of your home for other families to see on their walks. Encourage others in the neighborhood to do the same via Facebook or Neighborhood webpage.
